Detailed Job Description

Casual staff play a key role in:

1. Supporting visitors to our Science Oxford Centre on Family Days (Saturdays and some weekday school holidays), by:
 - a. helping visitors get the most from the hands-on exhibits in the Exploration Zone and at the outdoor Water Lab
 - b. supervising demonstrations or drop-in activities in our Live Lab space
 - c. supporting other events in the centre or in the woodland
 - d. checking-in visitors upon arrival to the Science Oxford Centre and assisting with queries.
2. Working with Club Leaders to assist with our Saturday Science Clubs, Creative Computing Clubs and Nature Clubs, by:
 - helping to set up and clean up after events
 - supporting club attendees with activities
 - checking-in guests, giving directions, and answering questions.
3. Light cleaning, required to ensure a safe and enjoyable environment for all staff and visitors, which may include:
 - wiping down exhibits and pieces of equipment
 - sanitising touch points in toilets, corridors, and lobbies
 - occasional spot-cleaning and toilet checks during events.

General Management

Like everyone, casual staff must **take responsibility for themselves in the workplace**, for example:

1. taking care of their personal health and safety by following safe systems of work, and reading and following the requirements of our health and safety policy and processes
2. listening to other people, following instructions and not being afraid to ask questions in any situation where something is not clear
3. giving full co-operation to colleagues requiring assistance in a prompt and helpful manner
4. asking for help and guidance from their line manager when needed to ensure that the best support available can be given.

Background information
